SENEGAL AT A GLANCE

GEOGRAPHICAL LOCATION

Located in West Africa, Senegal is a land of contrasts, human warmth, and cultural richness. Bordered by the Atlantic Ocean, the country shares its borders with Mauritania, Mali, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, and completely enclaves The Gambia. Its capital, Dakar, is a crossroads of modernity, tradition, and artistic effervescence.



KEY INFORMATION

SENEGAL



The Senegalese flag, adopted in 1960 when the country gained independence, consists of three equal vertical stripes of green, yellow, and red, with a five-point green star in the center.



The country covers an area of approximately 195,000 km², making it the 35th largest country in Africa.



With a population of nearly 19 million in 2025 (source: United Nations), Senegal is the 25th most populous country in Africa. The median age is 19.3 years.



The official language of the country is French. The main lingua franca is Wolof. Many other languages are spoken, such as Serer, Joola, Fulani, Mandinka, and Toucouleur.



Time zone: GMT (UTC +0) all year round

DAKAR



With nearly 4 million inhabitants, Dakar is one of the largest cities in Africa. It is among the 20 most populous cities on the continent. The city's population is growing rapidly.

Dakar accounts for nearly 20% of the country's total population and 80% of its economic activity.

CLIMATE

Senegal has a tropical climate and is sunny all year round, but with two distinct seasons:

- a dry season (November-May), with temperatures ranging from 20°C to 30°C
- a rainy season (June-October), with temperatures ranging from 25°C to 35°C

SPORT

Sport plays an essential role in the daily lives of Senegalese people!

THE MOST POPULAR SPORTS



FOOTBALL

Football is the most popular sport in the country! The men's national team, the Lions of Teranga, have participated in three World Cups, including a quarterfinal appearance in 2002, and won the Africa Cup of Nations in 2022.

SENEGALESE WRESTLING (LAAMB)

Senegalese wrestling, or *laamb*, is an extremely important and popular traditional sport in Senegal. It incorporates cultural and folkloric elements (*bakk*), and the greatest wrestlers are true stars.



OTHER SPORTS

Other sports are also very popular in Senegal, such as basketball. With 47 national Olympic and non-Olympic federations affiliated with the Senegalese National Olympic and Sports Committee (CNOSS), Senegal has a rich and varied sporting ecosystem.

SENEGAL AT THE OLYMPIC GAMES

Senegal participated in the Olympic Games for the first time in Tokyo in 1964.



A SILVER MEDAL

Amadou Dia Ba won Senegal's only Olympic medal in history. It was a silver medal, won in the 400m hurdles (athletics) at the 1988 Olympic Games in Seoul.

PARIS 2024

At Paris 2024, the country recorded its 15th participation in the Olympic Games. 11 athletes (4 women and 7 men) represented the country.

RELIGION

Senegal is a country of **great religious diversity**, marked by **remarkable tolerance among different faiths**. Religious leaders play a key role in preserving social harmony. While secularism is enshrined in the Constitution, religion continues to exert a strong influence on society.

GOOD TO KNOW

- Respect prayer times, especially in public spaces or during events.
- Friday is the holy day for Muslims. It remains a working day, but schedules are often adjusted around Friday prayers.
- Sunday is the day of Mass for Christians and also the official day of rest for all workers.

CULTURE

ETHNIC AND LINGUISTIC DIVERSITY

Senegal is composed of several ethnic groups, each with its own traditions and languages: the Wolof (the majority), the Serer, the Fulani, the Toucouleur, the Diola, the Mandinka, etc.

The official language is French, but **Wolof** serves as the lingua franca throughout the country.



MUSIC AND DANCE

Traditional music in Senegal varies by region and ethnic group, featuring instruments such as the sabar, tam-tam, kora, and balafon.

Mbalax, the country's most popular genre, fuses traditional rhythms with modern influences and has been brought to international fame by artists like Youssou N'Dour, Ismaïla Lo, Baaba Maal, and Viviane Chidid.



SPIRIT OF TRADITION

Traditional beliefs shape rituals, celebrations, music, and social life in Senegal.

Core cultural values such as *jomm* (dignity) and *kersa* (modesty and respect) are deeply embedded in daily life and guide interpersonal relationships across the country.



GASTRONOMY

Senegalese cuisine is one of the richest and most varied in West Africa. It is characterized by **flavorful, generous dishes, often prepared in large quantities and shared with family or friends around the same table.** It blends local traditions with North African, French, and even Asian influences.

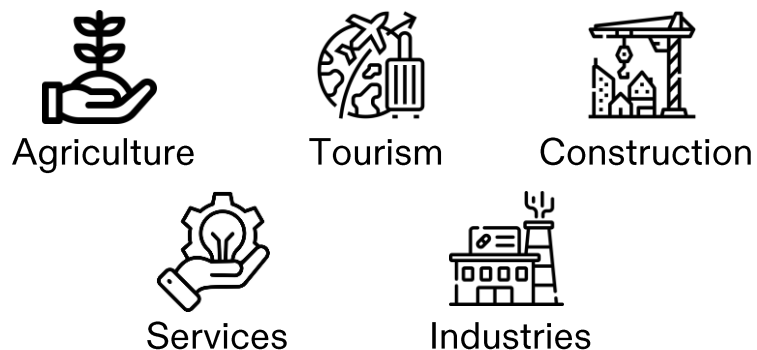
GOOD TO KNOW

- In Senegal, meals are a time for sharing. They are often eaten straight from a communal dish, using the hands (usually the right hand), with great importance placed on politeness and respect.

ECONOMY & INDUSTRIES

In 2024, Senegal posted stable economic growth and a GDP of US\$32 billion, with the vast majority of activity concentrated in Dakar. This momentum is conducive to public and private investment, as well as the development of key sectors, particularly in transportation, hospitality, and telecommunications. It has enabled Senegal to establish itself as a **major player at the regional and continental levels**. These sectors also have a key strategic importance and role in the preparation of the 2026 Dakar Youth Olympic Games.

HEALTH

Senegal is a safe country from a health perspective. However, as with any tropical country, it is important to take certain precautions to fully enjoy your stay.



- There are no mandatory vaccinations in force, except in the event of a health emergency declared by the authorities. You are no longer required to present your vaccination record upon arrival at the airport.
- However, it is recommended that you are up to date with your national vaccination schedule, particularly for: yellow fever, hepatitis A and B, and meningitis.



- The risk of malaria infection is low, but it is recommended that you take the following preventive measures:
 - Take preventive antimalarial medication (depending on your health and the length of your stay);
 - Use mosquito repellent on your skin and wear long clothing (especially in the evening).



- In case of health problems while on site, there are reliable medical centers in Dakar and in some major cities (referral hospitals and private clinics). Please consult the public list of healthcare facilities in Senegal on the Senegal Services platform [here](#).



- Tap water, although drinkable, should be avoided. Opt for bottled mineral water.
- Be careful when buying food on the street. Wash food thoroughly, especially fresh produce (fruit and vegetables).

RECOMMANDATIONS

- Consult a travel doctor before your departure.
- Bring mosquito repellent, sunscreen, and basic medications (for diarrhea, headaches, fever, etc.).
- Please note that these recommendations are subject to change.

The currency of Senegal is the CFA franc (African Financial Community). The ISO code is XOF.

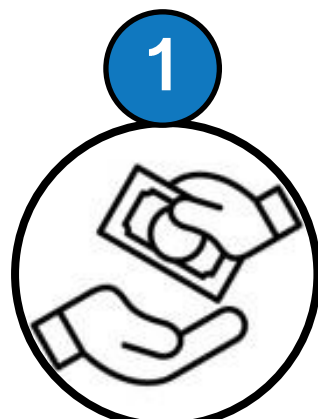

CASH

This is the most common method of payment, especially outside major cities.

- **Bills:** 500, 1 000, 2 000, 5 000, 10 000 CFA francs
- **Coins:** 50, 100, 200 et 250 CFA francs

MOBILE PAYMENT

Widely used, “mobile money” allows financial transactions (sending, receiving, or storing money) directly from a mobile phone, without using a traditional bank account.

Mobile payment apps are available for download from the App Store or Play Store. A SIM card and a Senegalese phone number are required to use them.

BANK CARD

Accepted in major hotels, restaurants, supermarkets, and gas stations, especially in Dakar.

GOOD TO KNOW

- It is recommended that you always carry some cash with you for small expenses.
- **Bargaining is normal in Senegal!** Negotiate prices, especially at the market or in taxis, while remaining polite and courteous.

MOBILE TELEPHONY

The Senegalese telecommunications market is well developed, with three major operators offering mobile phone services, mobile internet (4G), fiber optics, mobile money transfers, and sometimes digital television. The main one, Orange – Sonatel, is a Premium Partner of the Dakar 2026 Youth Olympic Games Organizing Committee.

Local SIM cards are available for purchase at the airport and at major Orange retail outlets.

GETTING AROUND

Senegal, particularly Dakar and its surrounding area, has a diverse transport network combining modern infrastructure with more traditional systems, which will be supplemented by transport services during the Games.

The Dakar 2026 YOCOG recommends the use of the following transport systems:

PRIVATE CHAUFFURED TRANSPORTATION

These are **mobile apps**, downloadable from the App Store or Play Store, for greater convenience and traceability.

Fares are announced before the journey and vary between 600 and 5,000 CFA francs in Dakar and up to 30,000 CFA francs to travel to the Diamniadio area and the airport.

Rental services are available, with rates ranging from 25,000 to 100,000 CFA francs per day depending on the type of vehicle.

CONVENTIONAL TAXI

Taxis do not have meters: you must negotiate the price before starting the journey.

The price varies between 1,000 and 5,000 CFA francs in Dakar. To/from the airport, you should expect to pay between 25,000 and 30,000 CFA francs.

ELECTRIC BUS

The **Bus Rapid Transit (BRT)** system operates only in Dakar and connects the competition venues in Dakar.

The price varies between 400 and 500 CFA francs for single journeys.

TRAIN

The **Regional Express Train (TER)** connects Dakar to Diamniadio, and will soon connect to AIBD airport.

The price varies between 500 and 1,500 CFA francs.

Less recommended in terms of safety, efficiency, and clarity of schedules and routes, more traditional public transportation systems are also available:

CONVENTIONAL BUS NETWORKS

The **public bus network** operates throughout Dakar. Fares range from 150 to 500 CFA francs.

CAR RAPIDE

The "**car rapide**" is a very popular form of public transport in Dakar due to its accessibility (frequency and fares).

The price varies between 100 and 200 CFA francs.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- To pay for transportation, carry cash, or use a mobile money app.

SAFETY

Senegal is recognized as one of **Africa's most stable and secure countries***, built on strong institutions, a deep-rooted democratic culture, and enduring social harmony.

As everywhere, visitors are encouraged to take simple precautions to ensure their safety.



RECOMMENDATIONS

- Avoid carrying valuable items in a conspicuous manner.
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash on your person in a visible manner.
- Never leave your personal belongings unattended.
- When traveling, use traceable transportation apps.
- Remain vigilant at night and avoid poorly lit streets.
- Be wary of snatch thefts on the side of the road, especially of phones.

In Dakar, the Almadies district — favored by the wealthiest classes — along with neighborhoods such as Mermoz, Sacré-Cœur, Fann, and Liberté 6, are considered among the city's safest.

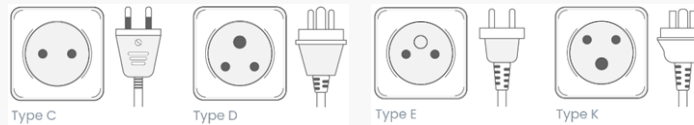
In contrast, extra vigilance is recommended in crowded areas like the Colobane and Sandaga markets, and it is best to avoid peripheral neighborhoods without a clear purpose, particularly after dark.

Please note these practical and useful tips for your stay in Senegal:





- International visitors are regularly asked to donate money or buy products. Even if you are not interested, you should remain patient, polite, and courteous.
- Driving is on the right. Traffic can sometimes be very disordered, so caution is advised.
- Types of electrical outlets used: types C, D, E, and K



DOS

-  ✓ Always greet people when you arrive somewhere. Greetings are very important in Senegalese culture.
-  ✓ Bring light clothing, a sweater for the evenings, and a waterproof jacket during the rainy season.
-  ✓ Use Internet calls (international calls on traditional mobile networks are expensive).
-  ✓ Research recommended restaurants via traditional platforms and websites.

DON'TS

-  × Photographs of military sites, airports, law enforcement agencies, and official buildings are prohibited by law.
-  × Appropriate attire is required in public spaces, particularly in and around religious sites.
-  × Avoid giving money to children on the streets, so as not to attract attention.
-  × Ensure that you exercise a certain degree of modesty when expressing affection and intimacy in public spaces.

DIAMNIADIO

Diamniadio, often called the City of the Future, is a rapidly expanding urban hub located about thirty kilometers from Dakar. Conceived to ease congestion in the capital, it now stands as a model of modern, sustainable, and connected urban development. This ambitious project aims to establish a strategic center bringing together economic, administrative, academic, and technological functions.

Well connected to Dakar by the Train Express Régional and the highway, Diamniadio already hosts major infrastructures such as the Abdou Diouf International Conference Center (CICAD), several relocated ministries, universities, hotels, stadiums, an industrial zone, and the Park for Digital Technologies (PTN).

Today, Diamniadio is seen as a smart, inclusive, and innovation-driven city—ready to welcome the next generation in a modern environment that remains deeply rooted in African values.

SALY

Saly, also known as Saly-Portudal, is a renowned seaside resort on the Petite-Côte—literally the Little Paradise Coast—located about 80 km south of Dakar. It is one of West Africa’s most sought-after destinations, celebrated for its pristine beaches, vibrant nightlife, seaside leisure activities, and wide range of hotels.

As part of the Dakar 2026 Youth Olympic Games, Saly will play a central role by hosting several sports on Saly Beach West.

This temporary venue, specially designed for the occasion, will create a unique blend of sport, nature, and Senegalese hospitality, offering young athletes from around the globe an exceptional stage to compete on the shores of the Atlantic Ocean.

PINK LAKE

Also called Lake Retba, the Pink Lake is a large yet shallow lagoon, located a few hundred meters from the ocean and surrounded by dunes and casuarina trees. It owes its color to the presence of microorganisms and the high concentration of minerals. Many campsites and hotels can be found around the lake, welcoming visitors and offering discovery and leisure activities.



THE ALMADIES CORNICHE

Located in the Almadies district in the far west of Dakar, the Almadies Corniche offers a wide range of pleasant restaurants and bars by the sea. It is one of the liveliest districts in the city and a hub for nightlife, especially at weekends.



THE AFRICAN RENAISSANCE MONUMENT

The African Renaissance Monument is a 52-meter monument made of bronze and copper. It was constructed on one of the two hills of Les Mamelles, the highest of which already bears the Mamelles lighthouse. The monument depicts a couple and their child standing tall towards the sky. It was officially inaugurated on April 3, 2010, during the ceremonies marking the 50th anniversary of Senegal's independence.



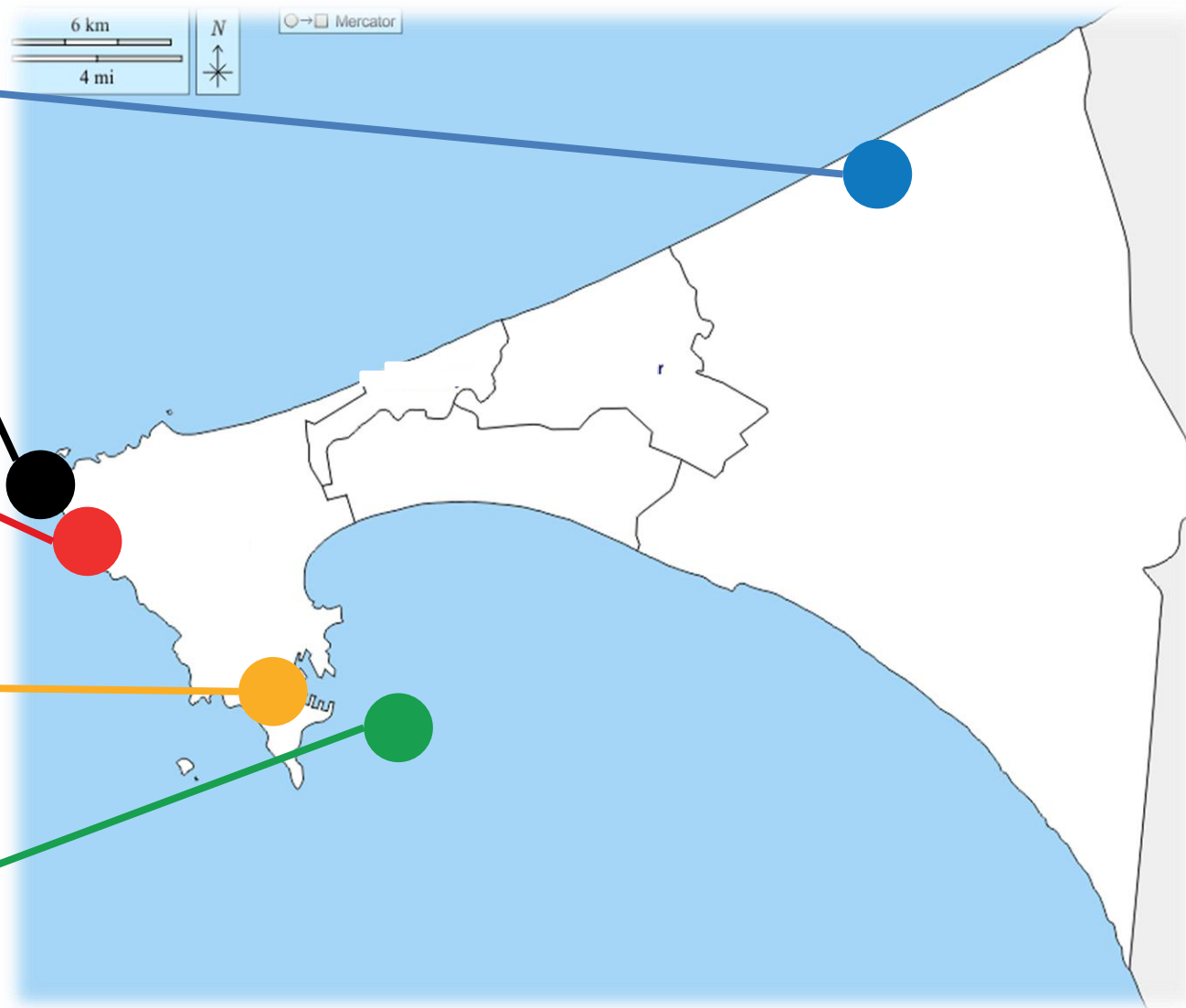
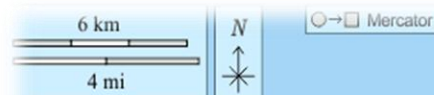
MUSEUM OF BLACK CIVILIZATIONS

The Museum of Black Civilizations is a state museum that opened on December 6, 2018. Covering a total area of 15,000 square meters, it is dedicated to African civilizations and was designed with the aim of highlighting Africa's contribution to the world's cultural and scientific heritage. It is a landmark venue for civilizational encounters and dialogue between cultures.



GORÉE ISLAND

The Gorée Island, or simply Gorée, is an island located in the bay of Dakar. It is a symbolic place of remembrance for the slave trade in Africa, officially recognized by the United Nations (UN) in 1978. Gorée, the "island of memory" for this tragedy, remains until today a symbol of human exploitation and a sanctuary for reconciliation.

SAINT-LOUIS

Saint-Louis (in wolof: Ndar) is one of the largest cities in Senegal, and historically one of the most important as evidenced by its inclusion on UNESCO's World Heritage List. The region offers exceptional cultural, historical and natural wealth, including various touristic activities in its surroundings - such as the Djoudj Park or the Lompoul desert for instance.



BANDIA NATURAL RESERVE

Bandia Reserve is a natural reserve located 65 km from Dakar on the road to Saly. It is a small gem testifying of the ecological success thanks to the regeneration of its flora and the reintroduction of large African mammals, some of which had disappeared from the region centuries ago: rhinos, giraffes, zebras, buffalo, as well as numerous species of birds and reptiles.



SINE-SALOUM

Sine Saloum is a region located in the South of the Petite-Côte. Formerly part of the Serer kingdoms of Sine and Saloum, it forms a delta at the confluence of the two rivers of the same name. Rich in history and culture, this 180,000-hectare region also boasts a unique natural heritage. The Saloum Delta National Park is listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.



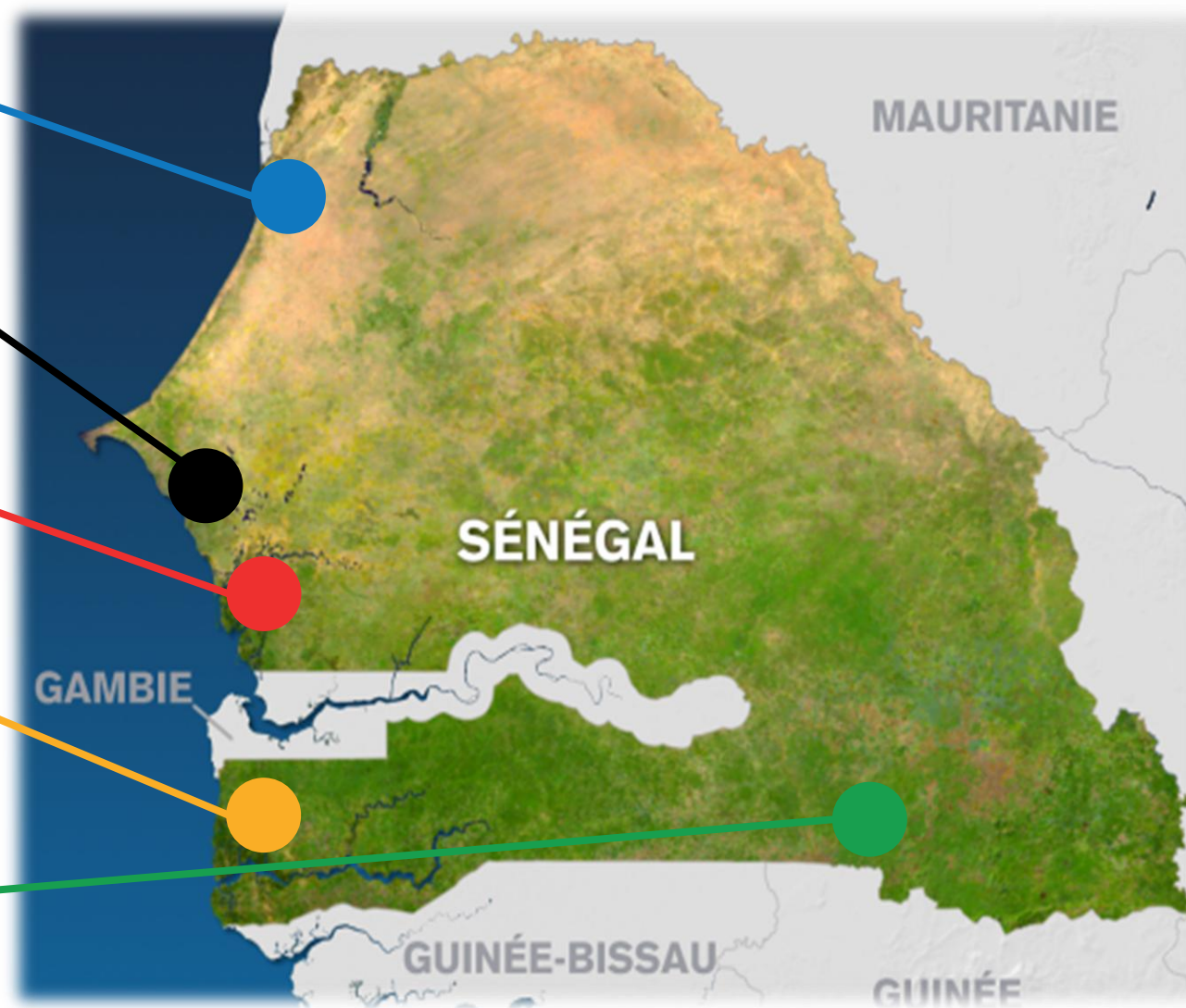
CASAMANCE

Known for its breathtaking beaches, palm groves, forests and mangroves, Casamance is a natural region located in the southwestern part of Senegal, which takes its name from the 300-kilometer river that runs through it. The uniqueness of Casamance can be perceived not only through its cultural diversity, but also through the extraordinary natural resources it offers, making it an iconic region of Senegal.



NIKOKOLO-KOBA NATIONAL PARK

Niokolo-Koba is a national park located 650 km in the South-East of Dakar in the region of Kédougou. It is served by Niokolo-Koba airfield, a dirt runway. The forests and savannahs of Niokolo-Koba are home to a rich variety of wildlife, including Derby elands, chimpanzees, lions, leopards, elephants, and numerous birds, reptiles, and amphibians.
